Jeroen Gunning is Visiting Professor of Middle East Politics and Conflict Studies at the Department of Political Science at Aarhus University. He has held positions at King's College London, Durham University, Aberystwyth University and the University of Oxford. With Morten Valbjørn, he is co-director of the research project TOI: 'Bringing in the Other Islamists - comparing Arab Shia and Sunni Islamism(s) in a sectarianised Middle East'. His research focuses on political contestation in the Middle East, with a specific focus on the interplay between social movements, religion, electoral politics, repression, violence and structural change. He is one of the world's leading scholars on the politics of the Palestinian Islamist movement Hamas and is currently working on two overlapping projects focusing on Hizballah's evolution and on everyday security and peace practices in Beirut's Southern Suburbs. He has written a critically acclaimed social movement theory explanation of the 'Egyptian Revolution' of 2011 and is one of the founders of the field of critical terrorism studies. He has taught and advised both policy-makers and civil society organisations.
